

# General Camp COVID-19 Protocol

## Per CDC and DuPage County Health Department Guidelines:

The Glen Ellyn Park District Camp Programs will adhere to the following protocol for quarantine and isolation.

### **QUARANTINE PROTOCOL:**

#### Exposed to COVID-19, NOT vaccinated or NOT up-to-date on series of vaccines:

- Stay home for at least 5 full days (day 0 is the first day of exposure)
- Wear a mask and get tested even if you do not have symptoms at least 5 days from exposure (day 0 is the first day of exposure). Watch for symptoms & isolate if symptoms develop. \*Negative test is required to return to camp.

## Exposed to COVID-19 and up-to-date on vaccinations:

- •No quarantine unless symptoms develop - GEPD camper must be <u>FULLY</u> vaccinated.
- •Wear a mask and get tested at lease 5 days after exposure (day 0 is the first day of exposure) even if you do not have symptoms. Isolate if symptoms develop.

  \*Negative test is required to return to camp.

## Exposed to COVID-19 confirmed case with test results within the past 90 days:

- •No quarantine unless you have or develop symptoms.
- •Wear a mask and watch for symptoms. Isolate immediately if symptoms develop.

### **ISOLATION PROTOCOL:**

#### **Ending Isolation for POSITIVE cases WITH symptoms:**

- You may leave isolation after 5 full days (day 0 is the onset of symptoms, day 1 is the first full day of symptoms), are fever free without medication and symptoms have subsided.
- Continue to wear a well fitting mask, do not go to places where you are unable to wear a mask for at least 10 days after first symptoms.

## **Ending Isolation for POSITIVE cases WITHOUT symptoms:**

- You may leave isolation after 5 full days (day 0 is the day of your positive test, day 1 is the first full day after your positive test result.)
- •If you develop symptoms after your positive test result, the 5 day isolation would start over.

After quarantine period, a negative COVID test will be required to return to camp. A negative PCR (molecular) test, rapid antigen test or doctor's note must be provided. Camper must also be fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication and 48 hours free from vomiting/diarrhea without medication.

Campers returning to camp after isolation due to a positive COVID-19 test result do not need to provide a negative test to return, but may require a doctor's release. If you have questions, please contact the assigned camp's supervisor to discuss plans for your child's return to camp.

If <u>NO</u> testing is completed for an infected individual, sibling *or* close contact, symptom free campers may return to camp after a 10-day quarantine period with doctor's note. Please contact the supervisor for further instructions.
